DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AT UN WOMEN

MODERN HIGH ALUMNA STRESSES WOMEN'S SUCCESS IN COVID FIGHT

Need women leaders to change lives

Calcutta: Modern High School alumna Anita Bhatia, the UN Women deputy executive director, stressed the need for women leaders in decision-making roles, influencing policy and changing laws while speaking from New York with students of her school.

"The problems that the world faces today, the existential threats of climate change, the erosion of democracy, the erosion of liberal values, and the erosion of secularism, require a new kind of leadership. Is it any surprise

that the countries that have done the best job in dealing with this pandemic are countries run by women — Germany, New Zealand, Finland, Taiwan among others," she said while speaking to the students on 15th week.

Bhatia is the assistant secretary general for resource management, sustainability and partnerships and the deputy executive director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of women (UN Women).

The girl from the Class of 1979 said, "We need more female leaders. We need

women at the table, making decisions, influencing policy and changing lives. And I am so proud to be part of the family of Modern High School because every day Modern High School produces leaders who are capable of doing just that."

Bhatia has been working with women globally, addressing gender rights and issues of discrimination.

The school recognised her as the "distinguished alumna" of 2020 during a webinar attended by present and past students and teachers joining from various time zones.



Teachers' Day always brings back fond memories of our time at MHS. Celebrations at college and university were special in their own way, but they never matched the grandeur of the MHS days, particularly during middle school, when we used to put up little shows in our respective classrooms, and our teachers dropped by to see our performances. It was a time to let the budding playwright, choreographer and performers in us to flourish, and we thoroughly enjoyed the practice sessions during the 10-minutes and lunch breaks and all the planning, discussions and disagreements that preceded it. The end result, if not world class, was certainly always enjoyable for us and hopefully for the teachers as well. At least, they sat through all of it with a smile on their faces! My own group of friends mostly ended up putting together elaborate dance performances thanks to some of the passionate dancers among us. I cannot dance to save my life even today, but I somehow ended up enjoying those rehearsals immensely. To this day, we can not listen to certain songs from the 90s without bursting out in peals of laughter or going all dewy eyed with nostalgia (Kahin aag lage lag jaye, Mehendi laga ke rakhna and Un dos tres y'all!), and other people around us have no clue what is going on! The other attraction was rustling up snacks in the classroom without using fire, and making cards for all our teachers. Our class specialized in making gigantic handmade cards where we all signed and put in little messages. When I say "we" made it, I of course mean a couple of artistic girls actually did all the work, while the rest of us stood around watching its progress. But that was part of the fun and build-up to the final day. While our celebrations turned more mature as we grew older (we are allowed to cook using fire now, for instance), nothing can ever match the excitement we felt back then as soon as we entered the last week of August.


